



Remembrance 2020 - Rock Art

With Remembrance commemorations curtailed or reduced locally and nationally this year due to Covid 19, this is a call to the churches, community and school in Bolney to remember in a creative way. Like the 'teddies in the windows' during lock down, we want to produce a visual reminder all over the village, which will be brought together to the memorial (corner of Rycroft Road /The Street) for **Remembrance Sunday 8th November**.

Find a pebble or pebbles (do as many as you like!) and paint a poppy on it. Acrylic paints work best. Place it/them somewhere in the village where people walking past will see it. (Don't forget to look out for them as you walk).

Then on **Sat 7th**, bring the pebbles to the memorial for a lasting visual display. You might want to paint the name of someone you knew who died in a war, or look up the names of the men of Bolney who fought in World War 1 or 2. Their names are on the memorial in the village, on the wall in St Mary's and on the Church website.

This isn't an art competition, and every pebble will be unique. No experience necessary – just a little time and enthusiasm!
