PCC of St Mary Magdalene, Bolney

Report for APCM 21 April 2024

1. At the start of 2023, we bade farewell to Claire George, long-serving PCC Secretary. Rev Michael's ministry continued through the greater part of 2023 following the announcement made in July of the termination of his licence in the autumn. A farewell service was held on 1st October 2023 when a presentation was made to Michael & Sabrina, made possible by the generosity of many parishioners. After three years in Bolney, Michael and Sabrina moved back to Norfolk.

2. This being a "House for Duty" post, the vicarage was duly vacated. Following an inspection by the wardens with the diocese property manager, the house is being kept ready for re-occupation.

3. Thanks to the invaluable support of our honorary "home team" comprising Fr Martin, Rev Ruth and Tony Bond, weekly services were maintained for the rest of the year with visiting priests also officiating. A number of weddings and funerals have taken place.

4. Events held during the year included special services at Easter, Christmas & other festivals and on the occasion of the coronation of King Charles 3rd last May. The church had a visible presence on Village Day when the Grand Draw took place, which raised £1,000 for PCC funds. The yearly Act of Remembrance at the war memorial attracted another good turnout.

5. The fabric of the church remains sound, although being an ancient building it requires regular maintenance. The five yearly survey (QI) is due in 2024 which may reveal the need for fabric repairs. The churchyard continues to be visited by many people locally, from other parts of the country and overseas. It is well maintained thanks to the hard work of Brian and Martin.

6. Following the previous editor's departure in February 2023, Bolney Magazine (owned by the PCC) took on a fresh lease of life thanks initially to Sabrina, who stepped into the breach at short notice and rescued the magazine from imminent closure, handing over its editorship to a new team (Karyn Kelley and Melanie Uniacke), who are taking it forward. The magazine is delivered free of charge to every house in the parish ten times a year, the cost of printing and production being financed by advertising.

7. On Rev Michael's initiative to spread awareness of the church more widely and help meet the challenge of funding its upkeep, a reception was held during the summer of 2023 attended by a number of parishioners who would not describe themselves as regular worshippers but for whom St Mary Magdalene, the only Grade 1-listed building in the parish of Bolney, is important. This resulted in the welcome addition of some fresh donors via PGS, and interest expressed in the formation of a Friends' Group.

8. Volunteers undertake a myriad of tasks from sweeping and cleaning the church to flower arranging, reading lessons, coffee tea-making, welcoming arrivals at the door, all of which enable the church to run smoothly. The wardens take this opportunity to thank each and every one for their much-valued contribution.

9. Towards the end of 2023, we welcomed the Rev Daniel Valentine as Vicar of Cuckfield and Bolney. The post of associate priest is to be advertised in April 2024.

MEETINGS.

The Council met on 5 occasions;-

January 2023, March 2023, May 2023, August 2023, and November 2023.

Three of the meetings were held at the Rawson Hall committee room, one at St. Mary Magdalene church, and one was held via video call (May 2023).

There were an average of 9 members present at each of the five meetings.

Maintenance of all church buildings , structural and otherwise. (including the now vacant Vicarage).

Maintenance of the churchyard.

Maintenance of Church Lane (access road).

Foundation Governor posts. (Bolney C of E school).

Ministerial House for Duty post (Currently vacant).

PCC meetings going forward. Rescheduling .

POLICIES.

Policies continue to be updated on the second PCC meeting after each APCM. A revision of the current policy regarding churchyard memorials, was proposed in order to give further guidance to persons tending Memorial stones and Burial plots.

CHARITY COMMISSION.

We are registered with the Charity Commission, and are required, at the end of each year, annually, to produce and file a report.

The PCC have a legal responsibility, and all members (as trustees), can access the Charity Commission website for further information on their responsibilities.

CHURCH WEBSITE.

We are indebted to Mr. Martyn Belsey, for his continued expertise and dedication.

In 2023 due to a system upgrade, he redesigned and rebuilt our Homepage , and edits and uploads other content when required.

BENEFICE OF CUCKFIELD AND BOLNEY.

We said our farewells to the Reverend Michael Windridge and his wife Sabrina, at his last service in late September 2023.

We welcomed the Reverend Daniel Valentine as our new vicar at his licensing at Holy Trinity Church Cuckfield on November 22nd 2023.

There remains a vacancy for a ministerial House for Duty post, with special responsibility for Bolney/ St. Mary Magdalene.

We have one post vacant. Rev'd D. Valentine having been licensed. Jennifer Harrison. PCC Secretary.

Financial statements for year ended 31 December 2023

1.The annual accounts for year ended 31st December 2023 were approved by the PCC at its meeting on 9th April 2024 and are presented to the APCM for adoption.

2.Net assets £24,207 (2022: £17,166). This comprises cash at bank £27,936 (2022: £18,746) less £3,729 (£1,580) owed to the diocese for parochial fees. Cash at bank is held in two bank accounts: a charity account with HSBC, closing balance £9,311 (2022: £525), and an interest-bearing deposit account with CCLA, closing balance £18,625 (2022: £18,221).

3.Income for 2023 £58,207 (2022: £62,624). Expenditure for 2023 £52,666 (2022: £62,467). Surplus for 2023 £7,041 (2022: £157).

4.The greater part of the PCC's income is derived from regular donors £40,767 (2022: £36,415). Thanks to encouragement from our previous vicar, several new donors signed up to the parish giving scheme (PGS) during the year. PGS is the preferred means of donating, being wholly digital with tax recovery under Gift Aid automatically applied.

5.Village Day raffle in 2023 produced £1,100 (2022: £1,325).

6.The single highest outgoing is parish share £24,800 (2022: £28,938). This accounts for approx. 43% of income.

7.Bolney Magazine advertising sales and contributions generated £7,448 (2022: £6,472). The cost of printing & production was £6,314 (2022: £8,052).

8.Maintenance and repairs have been relatively light over the last two years (£1,930 and £1,761). The five-yearly building survey (QI) is due in 2024, which may reveal the need for expenditure on the roofs, valley, eaves gutters and walls. Such costs can escalate at an alarming rate and will require careful planning by the PCC. The sum of £12,912 is held in a fund designated for quinquennial repairs.

9.Churchyard maintenance was £2,122 for the year in question and £2,131 in 2022. The PCC is fortunate to have the services of Brian Barker and Martin Burgess to keep the churchyard in good order. A grant of £1,500 was gratefully received from the parish council. For 2024, this is increased to £1,750.

The Bolney Guild of Ringers' Report 2023

The bells are in good condition and we only need to check them to see if they need greasing.

Since Covid-19 and other health problems with some of our ringers, we are down to 7 regular ringers (and occasionally 8 ringers.) We still practise whenever possible on Friday evenings from 7.45 pm- 9 pm. Occasionally, we have Advanced Practises with the Northern Division on a Monday evening about 2 or 3 times a year and we also have a few visiting bands who ask to come and ring the oldest peal of 8 bells in Sussex.

We try to ring on Sundays but that isn't always possible if there are only 4 of us.

We have rung for weddings this year and there are a couple of weddings in 2024.

Unfortunately, articles put in the Parish Magazine don't seem to produce anyone coming forward to enquire about learning nor do Open Tower Days although we may try advertising again through leaflets and another Open Tower sometime during the summer.

The website platform is specifically designed for churches and is hosted and managed by a 3rd party who provide a number of tools to enable functionality and localised design including the homepage, menus, calendar, contact forms, gallery and rotating images.

In 2023, they also implemented a major system upgrade which required the homepage to be redesign and rebuilt.

All of the current content including design, structure, layout, text, format, audio, photographs, video and graphics are created, edited and uploaded by myself.

Prior primarily to Christmas and Lent/Easter, additional seasonal promotional information and images need to be produced.

Additional features have also been incorporated that are reliant on other external applications, e.g. Pew News, Give a Little, Sermon archive and eBook functionality.

For it to remain a trusted and reliable source of information, the principal weekly task is to ensure that it accurately reflects forthcoming events and last minute changes - but as a village non-resident, it is sometimes challenging to receive information in a timely manner without a telephone call or email!
